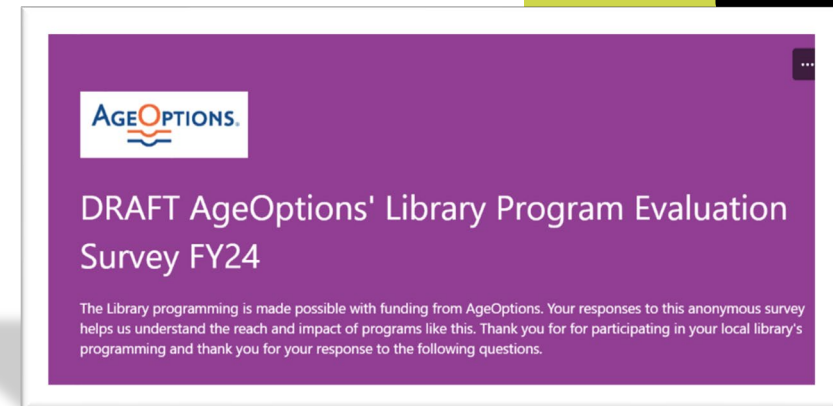

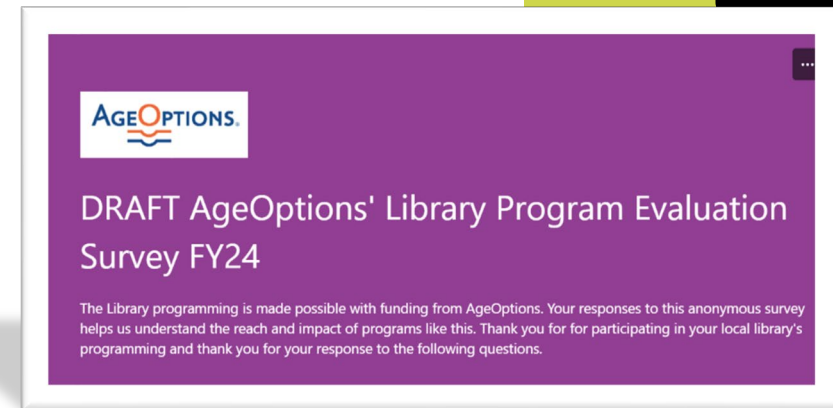

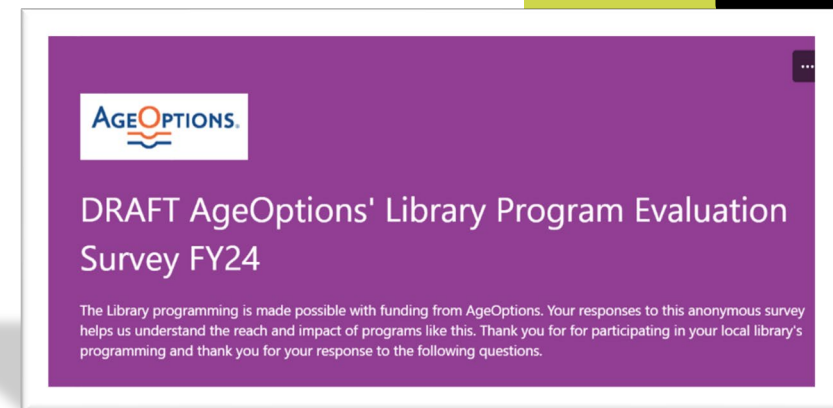

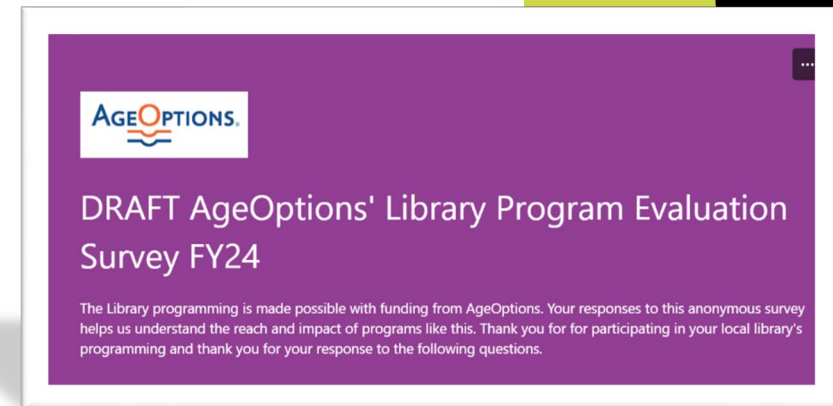

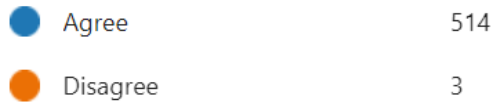

When I participate in programs and activities hosted by my local library, I feel welcomed,

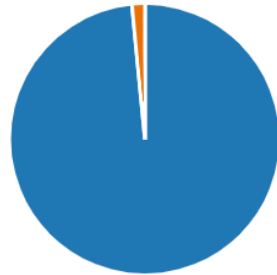

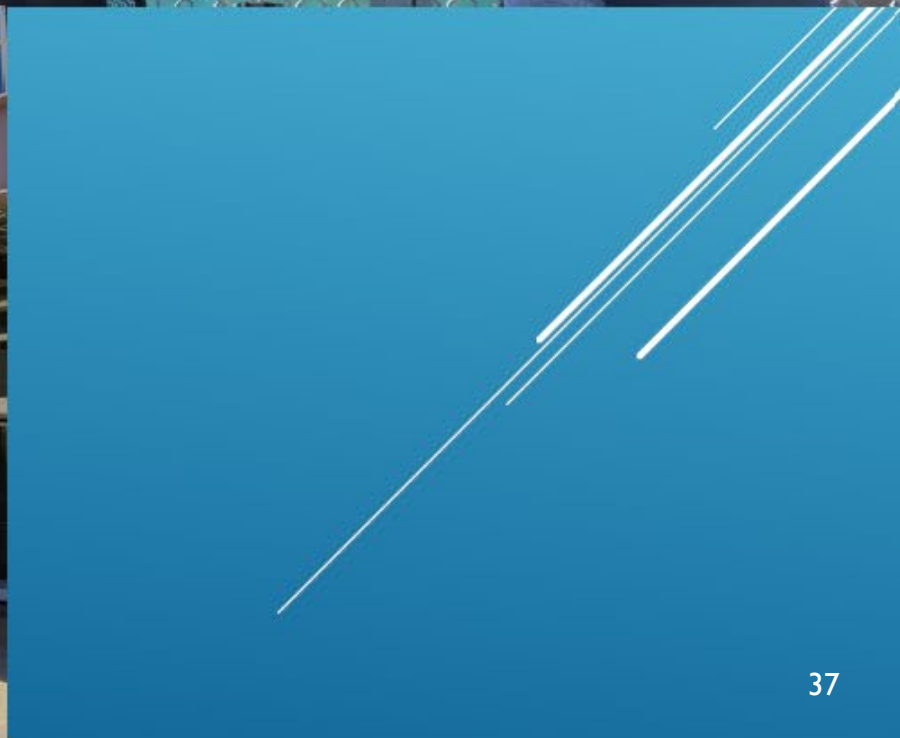
- ▶ Why go on a trip?

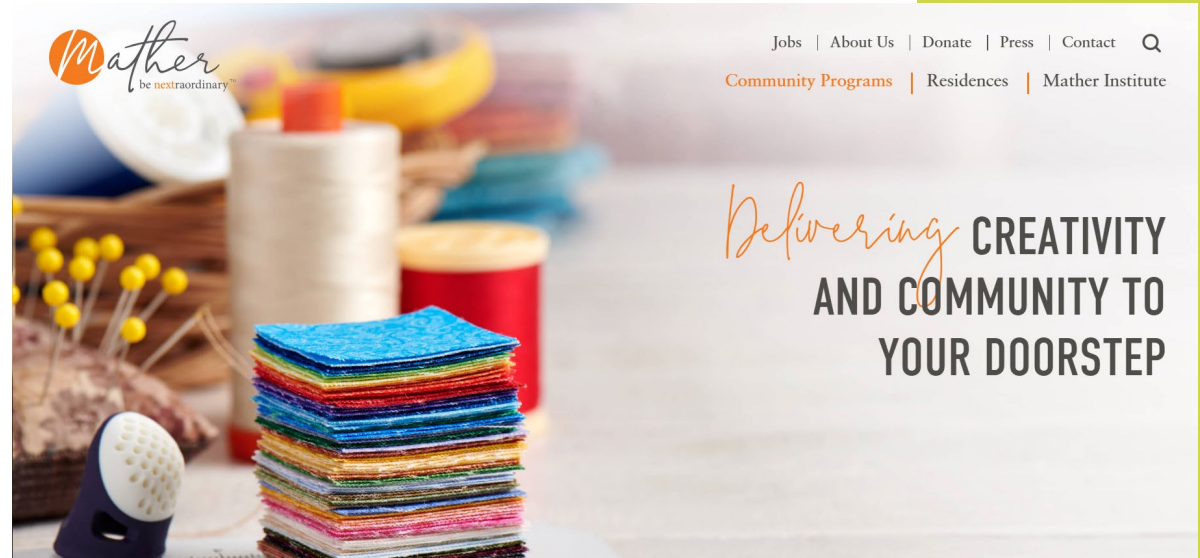
